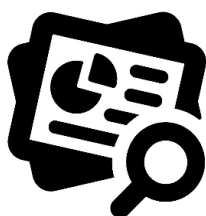


Have you thought about different options for sexually-transmitted and blood-borne infection (STBBI) testing?
